US superstar Beyoncé has 'Breton roots'

Superstar Beyoncé Knowles may be one of the biggest and most successful singers ever to come out of America, but her roots are well and truly French, or more precisely Breton, a French genealogical association claimed on Monday.

She may not dance in the traditional style of a Breton woman, but Beyoncé does in indeed have Celtic roots, according to the French genealogical association "Racines et Rameaux" (Roots and Branches).

The world-famous star, who is one of the most successful US artists of all time, has her origins in the tiny island of Belle-lle-en-Mer off the coast of the region of Brittany in the west of France.

According to the association, the former Destiny's Child singer's great-great-great-great grandmother was Marie-Francoise Trahan, a member of a family who fled Acadia, a French colony in present-day Canada, and settled in the Morbihan region of Brittany in the late 18th century.

Around a decade later Trahan is believed to have sailed from the west coast of France to the US state of Louisiana, where she then met her husband Joseph Broussard.

The great granddaughter of the couple was Celestine Anne, who is none other than Beyoncé's mother.

André Thomas, a local geneaologist who can also trace his ancestry back to Marie-Françoise Trahan, seemed non-plussed by being distantly related to Beyoncé. "I don't know her at all. Never heard her music. I don't really listen to music," he told The Local on Monday.

"Besides, we're used to finding famous people with Acadian roots - like Céline Dion, for example," added the resident of Belle-Ile-en-Mer, the largest of the islands off the coast of Brittany, situated some 14 km from the Quiberon Peninsular.

Speaking to local paper Le Télégramme, however, Thomas did note that his grandchildren were "amazed when I told them they were cousins of Beyoncé."

Born and raised in Houston, Texas, Beyoncé is most famous for her two chart-topping tracks Single Ladies and Crazy in Love.

According to France's TF1 TV, the discovery of her Breton roots was made by Jacques Nerrou the president of Racines et Rameaux, which specialises in researching the pioneers who left to settle in America before the 19th century.

Owner of Segway Company Dies in Segway Accident

The owner of Segway died on Sunday riding one of his company's electric scooters off a cliff and into a river.

The 62-year-old millionaire Jimi Heselden crashed into the River Wharfe in Northern England while inspecting his North Yorkshire estate, according to <u>multiple reports</u>.

Heselden was riding a rugged-country version of the Segway, which was also recovered at the scene, according to the <u>Telegraph</u>.

Unveiled in 2001, the <u>Segway was invented by Dean Kamen</u>, who dreamed of launching a transportation revolution. The scooter contains five gyroscopes linked to a set of computers to monitor a rider's center of gravity.

Heselden, chairman of Hesco Bastian and a former miner who earned millions from defense contracts, purchased the Segway company in early 2010.

iPhone 5 Update: Planned Obsolescence?

Do you still love your iPhone 5? Well, you've got six more days to make sure that you get to keep online functions such as the App Store, email, iCloud, Safari browsing, and the like.

Since releasing bug-fix updates back in July, Apple has been sending out full-screen alerts warning iPhone 5 users to update their Operating System (OS) to the latest iOS 10.3.4 before 12:00 A.M. UTC on Nov. 3. This is in accordance with the Global Positioning System (GPS) time rollover that happened last April 6 that affected devices relying on date and time to tell your locatio

The GPS technology works by using a time and date function, which defines a 10-bit number referred to as a "week number" or

WN, which means every 1,024 weeks, the WN that is transmitted resets to zero. Because of this, the devices which are relatively older and are manufactured without accounting for the rollover are suffering from the same issue.

If you don't update, you won't be able to go online.

According to Apple, failure to update your iPhone 5 before the said date would totally prevent the device from connecting to the internet, thereby preventing Over-The-Air (OTA) software updates or iCloud backup. However, your device can still be updated after Nov. 3 by connecting it to a computer, backing up your files, and restoring it with iTunes on a PC or Mac.

Planned Obsolecence

Just last year, the tech giant Apple was fined €10m in Italy after being found guilty of "planned obsolescence" by the nation's competition authority. Planned obsolescence is the intentional shortening of a smartphone's lifespan by its manufacturer. It is usually done by releasing updates that generally slow down a phone's performance, which forces you to upgrade to a better one or the latest model. With the iPhone 5 having a non removable-battery and practically everlasting, this new update could be another way for Apple to make older models obsolete.

How to Update

To update your iOS, you can go to Settings > General then Software Update. Additionally, to check if the update was done successfully, go to Settings > General > About. If the update was a success, the number beside software version should be iOS 10.3.4 for iPhone 5 and iPad 4th generation while iOS 9.3.6 for iPhone 4s, iPad mini, iPad 2, and iPad 3rd generation. Additionally, it must be noted that this issue doesn't affect any newer devices, iPad models with the Wi-Fi only function, and iPod touch.

Snowfall in Sahara Desert, a rare thing that happened in 2018

This year, Sahara Desert, the hottest place on earth received snow, much to the surprise of the locals as well as people around the world. Locals were stunned to wake up to a blanket of dense snow settling in their small town of Ain Sefra, popularly known as the 'gateway of the desert.' It actually snowed here for the fourth time in nearly 40 years.



As per Meteorologist Jason Nicholls, "The cold pool of air coupled with precipitation from the surface storm led to precipitation falling as snow instead of rain. The same feature responsible for the snow over the Sahara brought the heavy snow to the Alps earlier this week." Scientists are, however, not attributing this rare snowfall event to the climate change as extreme weather conditions might become more of a common thing in the future, as well as the climate changes.

Study reveals that the Sahara Desert covers most of Northern Africa and has gone through shifts in moisture and temperature over the past few thousand years. Actually, even though Sahara weather is too dry today, it is expected to become greener in around 15,000 years.



As per reports, more than 15 inches (40 cm) of snow blanketed the sand dunes across this small town. Although snowfall is a rare phenomenon in such a hot place, a similar thing happened even last year. Sahara being one of the hottest and driest places on earth, where temperature reaches to 122 degrees, witnessing snowfall is actually a rarity. The reason associated with the snowfall in this region is because of cold air aloft associated with a surface storm drifting from Spain to northern Algeria.
